



- Ask: Does everyone have rules to follow? (Yes)
- Ask: Rules for adults are called what? (Laws)
- Ask: There are laws in society and laws in the Church. what are the laws of the Church called? (Commandments)
- Ask: Does anyone remember what the word "dignity" means? (Worth)
- Ask: Do you have to be an adult to have dignity? (NO)
- Ask: Who in this room has dignity? (Everyone)
- Ask: Can anyone tell us why we have dignity? (Because we were all created by God.)
- Ask: Two great gifts that were given to us by God are our brain and what else? (Instinct)
- Ask: What is our instinct? (Our inner siren)
- Ask: Why is our instinct important? (It warns us of possible danger)

### **Development**

- To further unfold the topic play the following "game show."
  - Divide the group into 2 teams of not more than 5.
    - If there are more than 10 in your group, you have 2 options:
      - The first option would be to have 3 teams (of not more than 5)
      - The second option would be to set up 4 teams
        - Play one round with teams 1 & 2 and a second round with teams 3 & 4.
        - If time allows, the winning teams could then play against each other.
        - If there are an odd number of students, that student could be score keeper.
- Provide each team member with a noise maker of some type (clicker, bell, etc.)
- When a question is asked, the first team to "buzz in" must answer immediately.
- If they answer correctly, they get a point.
- If the answer is wrong, the opposing team has a chance to respond and if they answer correctly they get the point.
- If the answer is not correct, no points are awarded and you move on to the next question.
- The team with the most points wins.

### **Check for Understanding**

- Ask: Why do you think we review the Think First & Stay Safe program every year? (Answers will vary: to teach us how to be safe, to show us lures, etc.)
- Ask: Why do you think it is important for you to know these lures? (Answers will vary: so we can recognize when a situation could be dangerous, so we will know when a person may be trying to "lure" us.)

### **Closure**

- Say: Everyone has rules to follow even adults. Rules for adults are called laws.
- Say: Two very important gifts that God gave us are our brain and our instinct.
- Say: Everyone, no matter how old they are, has dignity because all were created by God.

### **Step Five:**

#### **Evaluation**

- Did the children learn to recognize the lures presented?

## Vocabulary Sheet

assault: physical or verbal attack

authority/authority figure: right to command, holder of power

bribe: to give somebody something (money, gift, etc) in order to get them to do something, especially something illegal or dishonest.

charismatic: possessing great powers of charm or influence

contaminated: polluted or poisoned

date rape: an assault or attempted assault usually committed by an acquaintance involving sexual intercourse without mutual consent.

devious: not sincere or honest about intentions or motives.

dignity: worthiness, worthy of respect, esteem or honor

ego: self esteem, someone's sense of their own importance, usually at an appropriate level.

exploitation: the practice of taking selfish or unfair advantage of a person or situation, usually for personal gain.

harassment: persistent threatening or tormenting behavior

imminent: about to occur

impair: to weaken something (as in through drugs or alcohol)

inappropriate: not fitting, not suitable

incapacitate: to make somebody or something weak

inhibitions: a feeling or belief that prevents somebody from behaving or speaking freely.

intimidate: to frighten somebody into doing or not doing something; to threaten or bully.

interfere: to delay, hinder or obstruct the natural or desired course of something.

intolerance: unwillingness or refusal to accept differences (in other people or situations).

manipulate: to control or influence somebody or something.

menacing: to be a threat to somebody; to behave toward or speak to somebody in a way that threatens injury or harm.

notorious: well known for some undesirable feature, quality or act.

personable: having a pleasant personality and appearance; likable, charming.

perpetrator: the person responsible for doing something usually something criminal or morally wrong.

prejudice: a preformed opinion, usually unfavorable, based on insufficient knowledge, irrational feelings or inaccurate stereotypes.

priority: having the greatest importance or urgency.

seduce: to persuade somebody to have sex, especially using a romantic or deceptive approach.

self worth: confidence in personal value as an individual

sexual exploitation: the practice of taking selfish or unfair advantage of a person or situation for sexual purposes.

status: rank, position

vulnerable: without adequate protection; easily persuadable; at risk.
